

A SIMPLE LENTEN PRAYER

Almighty and ever living God, you invite us deeper into your world, your people, your Lent. May this time be one of outward focus; seeking you in those we often ignore. Amen.

Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time Luke 6:39-45

The third and final section of Luke's Sermon on the Plain begins: And he told them a parable. There are actually four parables, three of which we read today. They are all about how to be a good disciple.

The blind cannot lead the blind. And a disciple cannot be a good disciple unless he or she has learned from the teacher.

Everyone who is fully trained is like the teacher who knows how to cure the blind. Before you can be a good disciple and teach others you must take care of yourself. Do not try to take a speck out of your brother's eye until you have taken the board out of your own.

Finally, only when you have purified yourself can you produce the good works that the teacher requires. Discipleship asks us to produce good deeds. But to produce them requires the integrity and purity of heart found in the teacher. When people see your good deeds they will know that this is because you have a good heart.

The final parable, which we do not read today, is about building on the solid foundation of rock and not on sand. This is the only way to face the difficulties a disciple will encounter and survive.

Part Time Bookkeeper

Our parish is seeking another part-time bookkeeper to join our staff in the office to assist our pastor and to work together with our accountant and current bookkeeper.

The following specific responsibilities are representative of duties required in this position. They may be unilaterally but reasonably changed based on the working environment and departmental needs:

Issue checks; pay bills and credit card; make monthly reports for Bingo games and for raffles and submit to State; gather employees' timesheets and process biweekly payroll; record deposits and disbursements in QuickBooks; monitor petty cash transactions and replenish balance when necessary; monitor parish online giving system; prepare monthly financial reports; prepare deposits for bank; and, other duties as assigned.

MAKING OF THE ASHES ON CARNIVAL or SHROVE TUESDAY

In preparation for Ash Wednesday, we invite everyone to come and take part in this brief and poignant service of reflection and preparation for Lent as we burn last year's Palm Sunday fronds to be used for this year's Ash Wednesday ashes.

If you still have the palms you received last year, bring them in! We'll gather in the parking lot (near the side doors of the Church & Ferraro Hall) this **Tuesday, March 4 at 6pm**, before the start of Mardi Gras.

Ash Wednesday

A day that begins the Lenten Season. This year why not make a commitment to observe Lent in a special way like never before and start by coming to Church this Wednesday.

Archdiocese of Newark

2025 Lenten Regulations

- 1. The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.
- 2. On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted, and two (2) smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.
- 3. Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.
- 4. On a day of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence. (Hence, even if you're 60 and older, you're obliged to abstain!)
- 5. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially", or as a whole, is a serious obligation.
- 6. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.
- 7. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty*) extends from the First Sunday of Lent, March 9 to The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, June 15, 2025.

*Canon 920, §1, All the faithful, after they have been initiate into the Most Holy Eucharist, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.

Lenten Prayer for Sundays

(Take some time to pray this each Sunday of Lent either on your own or as a family. Use it as a way to recommit to having your best Lent ever through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.)

Heavenly Father, as I enter another week of my Lenten journey, guide me to the path that leads to you. Fill my heart with gratitude, patience, strength, and peace as I strive to become the-best-version-of-myself, honestly admitting my shortcomings and sins. As I renew my resolve each day to become a better person, let me hear your voice in the deepest reaches of my heart. Give me rest in you. Help me to accept others, showing them your great love instead of casting judgment. Stay with me through the busy days this week and remind me that when I need comfort, solitude, wisdom, or guidance, I can always turn to you. Help me develop discipline and generosity through fasting and almsgiving, and come closer to you through prayer this Lent. In your name I pray. Amen.
