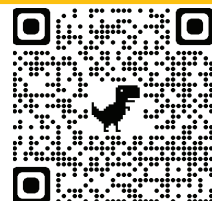

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick

A Brief Catechesis

Since we will have a Healing Mass during the visit of the Pilgrim Statue of Our Lady of Fatima, it is apt to present here a brief catechesis on the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick.

What is the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick?

Jesus came to heal the whole person, body and soul. In the Church's Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick, through the ministry of the priest, it is Jesus who touches the sick to heal them from sin – and sometimes even from physical ailment. His cures were signs of the arrival of the Kingdom of God.

Who can receive this Sacrament?

The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is for any member of the faithful who face a serious illness or surgery or who are impaired by old age. It is distinct from the “Last Rites,” or Viaticum, in which the Church offers Holy Communion as food for the journey to life eternal.

One may celebrate the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick many times if needed for strength and healing in mind, body, and spirit. In this sacrament of anointing, Christ strengthens our faith and bestows God’s grace in a time of anxiety and pain.

Why is this Sacrament important?

This sacrament helps unite those who are suffering with Jesus' saving and healing power. Through this sacrament people receive forgiveness for their sins (especially if the critically ill persons are unable to receive the sacrament of Penance), and comfort in their suffering; they are restored in spirit; and sometimes they even experience the return of physical health.

Although this sacrament is for spiritual healing and is directed to the forgiveness of sins, it is not principally for the forgiveness of sin as to the guilt of sin (this is what Confession or Penance is for), but rather as to the “remnants” or “vestiges” of sin.

There are five effects of the Anointing of the Sick. It unites us to Christ's Passion, strengthens us to endure suffering, forgives our sins, restores our health if it's conducive for our salvation, and prepares us to enter eternal life.

Who is the administrator of Anointing of the Sick?

The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick (formerly known as Extreme Unction) is administered only by a priest, or, of course, a bishop. The Catechism specifies, “Only priests (bishops and presbyters) are ministers of the Anointing of the Sick” (*No. 1516*).

Thus, according to canon law, priests or bishops, but not deacons, can administer the sacrament of anointing of the sick. Deacons should not use the Oil of the Sick (*oleum infirmorum, O.I*) and anoint those who request for prayer of healing.

When to ask this Sacrament?

If you know you will be hospitalized for a planned surgery, you should contact the parish before you enter the hospital to arrange a time to celebrate the sacrament. Often the Sacrament of Anointing can be celebrated after Mass. Call the Parish Office to arrange for the Sacrament.

If someone is in the hospital, simply notify the Catholic Chaplain and they will make arrangements for the Sacrament of the Sick to be offered.

Does a person have to be dying to receive this sacrament?

No. The Catechism says, “The anointing of the sick is not a Sacrament for those only who are at the point of death.”

EMERGENCY

If there is an emergency and need immediate assistance for the Sacrament of the Sick, call the parish office.
