



28th Sunday in Ordinary Time Luke 17:11-19

October 12, 2025

Today we hear about how Jesus, continuing on his journey to Jerusalem, heals 10 lepers. This story is a lesson about faith and reminds us that faith is sometimes found in unlikely places. Ten people afflicted with leprosy cry out to Jesus. Struck with pity, Jesus heals all 10. However, only one is described as glorifying God and returning to thank Jesus. The one who returns is a Samaritan, a foreigner. In the Jewish circles in which Jesus lived, Samaritans were upon because looked down of the differences between the two communities in their observance of Judaism. significant, therefore, that Jesus commends the Samaritan for his faith, which has been his salvation. Throughout Luke's Gospel, faith is found in surprising places.

Another lesson for us in this Gospel has to do with salvation. All 10 of the lepers were given the gift of healing, but in his gratitude to God for this gift, the Samaritan found salvation. Our salvation is found in recognizing the gifts we have been given and knowing to whom we must offer our thanks.

WHY DO I NEED A PARISHIONER NUMBER AND WHY SHOULD I USE MY ENVELOPES OR WHY SHOULD I USE VANCO?

Are you a registered parishioner? If you are, you probably receive collection envelopes in the mail every two months or so. (Sometimes the post office doesn't deliver, but you can pick up a set at the office if you haven't received on time or you can opt for automatic electronic withdrawal with VANCO—scan the URL on page 1 for more info). The reason why you should be registered and use your envelopes is that when the time comes that you need a special permission letter so you can sponsor a baptism or confirmation or when you are preparing for marriage it will make it so much easier So, if you are not registered, please call the Parish Office. If you are registered and you are not receiving envelopes we can set you up or if you do not want envelopes delivered then we can let you know your parishioner number so you can put that number on your check or on the envelope provided in church. Try to use the envelope at all times and print clearly please. It is important to know also that the church reports to the Archdiocese how many registered parishioners we have and how many actually attend Mass. The envelope system helps with this. Your attendance at Mass is so important to our Parish but most important to your spiritual health. Be sure to attend and receive the sacraments of Penance and Eucharist regularly.
