POPE FRANCIS' PRAYER FOR PEACE

Lord, God of Abraham, God of the Prophets, God of Love, you created us and you call us to live as brothers and sisters. Give us the strength daily to be instruments of peace; enable us to see everyone who crosses our path as our brother or sister. Make us sensitive to the plea of our citizens who entreat us to turn our weapons of war into implements of peace, our trepidation into confident trust, and our quarreling into forgiveness.

AMEN.

Let the children come to the Holy Mass!

Based on Jesus' invitation (*Mt 19:14, Mk 10:14, Lk18:16*), we encourage parents to bring their children to Mass for a few important reasons:

(1) The importance of attending Mass together as a family. For a family that prays together stays together. Indeed, children need to see their parents on their knees before Our Lord.

(2) The importance of developing habits of prayer in small children. This cannot be done by leaving them at home when everyone else goes to Mass. It is done by bringing them into Mass, by exposing them to the atmosphere of the liturgy, and consistently encouraging them, over a period of years, to be quiet, and as they get older, to attend more closely to the action of the Mass.

(3) The importance of learning the virtues of faith, hope and love. Attending Mass helps the children develop a love and fascination for sacred things, especially a love for and hungering after the Real Presence of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist. When brought to Mass frequently, children more quickly learn the language of the faith. Behavior at Mass gets better at an earlier age if they are taken from an early age and become used to going. Faith becomes interwoven into the "fabric" of their lives.

When the children become noisy or disruptive during the Mass, the following reminders may be useful:

(1) Use common sense in terms of noise – not too quick to jump if there is some very "light" noise or murmuring. They are children, not adults. ***But, if a baby is wailing or a child is "throwing a fit," take him/her to the vestibule.*** Unfortunately, here at St. Anthony's we do not have the space available for a crying room. And,

(2) If you are distracted by a little kid being a little kid, you are not focused on what's holy. Little kids are holy. Let them be and be patient with them. Remember that children are not trying to be disruptive. But we also don't want to teach them that all they have to do is be loud and we'll take them out to the vestibule. By trying to keep them in the church, we are trying to set an example for them of how to behave. We want them to see what goes on, be a part of the congregation, and understand what's expected of them so they can learn the routine. Our kids can't learn how to behave in Mass if they are never in Mass.

Again, let the children come to the Holy Mass every Sunday! Of course, needless to say, parents should be with them too!
