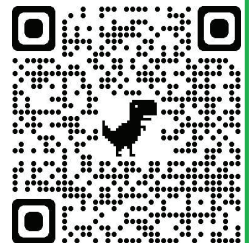

**ST. TERESA OF JESUS
(AVILA)**

Lord, grant that I may always allow myself to be guided by You, always follow Your plans, and perfectly accomplish Your Holy Will. CATECHESSES ON THE HOLY MASS

(Part 4)

What is the purpose of the small water bowls at the entrance of the church?

The holy water bowls are present so that we may bless ourselves as we enter into Christ's presence. Each time we do this, we are renewing our baptismal commitment with water and the invocation of the Trinity, and it serves to focus our minds on our purpose in being in church. By doing so, we implore God's grace and protection as well.

How does Mass begin?

The entrance procession begins as the congregation has gathered and soon after the entrance soon is begun (or antiphon is said). The priest and the ministers walk slowly to the altar, while everyone else stands. The priest and the ministers bow to the altar. The priest then goes to the altar and kiss it, while the ministers take their spots.

Why does the priest (and deacon) kiss the altar at the beginning and end of the Mass?

[In addition to part 2 answer - September 25, 2022 issue] In kissing the altar, the priest symbolizes the bond between Christ and his church; reverences the person of Christ, which the altar represents; acknowledges the sacrifices of those martyrs (relics) who gave their life for the furtherance of the faith; and, when performed with the deacon, is an extension of peace to the community.

After the sign of the cross and the greeting, why does Mass begin with a prayer of repentance for sins?

We gather as a Holy People of God. So, we begin by acknowledging our sinfulness and asking God's forgiveness so that nothing will keep us from union with Him. With proper participation, Mass forgives our venial sins, but we must still participate in the Sacrament of Reconciliation to receive absolution for forgiveness of mortal sins.

Why is it so important to call on God's mercy?

The *Kyrie Eleison* (Lord, Have Mercy) is sung or recited by all to praise the Lord and call on His mercy. Mercy is one of God's greatest attributes. We ask the Lord for mercy because we acknowledge that He is the Lord of forgiveness and wants to forgive our sins – we need only approach Him saying, we are sorry.

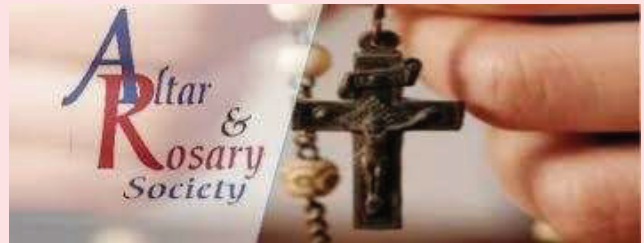
What do priest's hand gestures mean?

In the orans (means "praying") posture (extending hands to the sides, slightly elevated), the priest is physically opening and surrendering himself to God. Moreover, the priest's outstretched hands remind us of Christ outstretched on the cross, opening his arms and drawing us to Himself. Indeed, the cross adds depth to this simple gesture of prayer.

A Kernel of History

(Part 50)

With the altar, sanctuary floor and reredos completed, the renovation to the air conditioning and lighting system and the reparation of the original church bells was underway by November. And so, on November 23, 2003 Bishop Arthur Serratelli consecrated the new altar. The ceremony, which consisted of the blessing of the altar with holy water, incense and holy oils, was followed by the cleaning and setting of the altar with newly made linens donated by the Rosary Altar Society. The Holy Name Society processed placing the candles at the altar and the children of the parish presented flowers at the altar. Once the altar was set, Bishop Serratelli celebrated the first Mass on the New Altar. Upon completion of the Mass with great celebration, for the first time in over 48 years since electric chime recordings were installed, the original bells in the bell tower were again proudly ringing. Then, in December, the walk-in confessional was demolished, and all further work was put on hold in observance of the Christmas holidays.

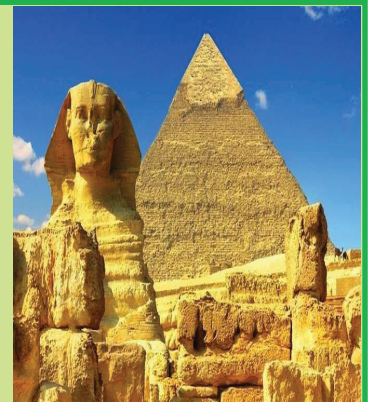
